

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# **Report on Haemoglobin and Health Check-up Camp**

The National Service Scheme, Women Development Cell of the College Cell and Rotary Club of Kalyan, Primary Health Care Hospital Sonawala jointly organised a Health camp on Haemoglobin check-up and Thallasaemia Test. The camp was organized for the staff and students of the college.

The Health Check-up camp began at 09.30 am on 17<sup>th</sup> March 2023 and continued till 05.00 pm. Dr.R.P.Paul, the Principal, in his inaugural address hinted the need of testing for Thalassaemia for its deadly blood disorder.

Mr.Vidyadhar Gangurde, representing Rotary Club of Thane delivered a informative speech on Thalassaemia . He said that the Thalassaemia test is required only once in life time. He suggested the youngsters to convey this message to their peer group before getting themselves married. No matter if one of the partners is Thalassaemia Minor. If both the husband and wife are Thalassaemia minor, there is a possibility that their child could be a Thalassaemia Major. He quoted the case of Superstar Amitabh Bacchan who is the holder of Thalassaemia minor. He is survived luckily as Jaya Bacchan, his wife is not Thalassaemia minor.

Express his view haemoglobin test measures the levels of haemoglobin in the blood. Haemoglobin is a protein in the red blood cells that carries oxygen from the lungs to the rest of the body. If the haemoglobin levels are abnormal, it may be a sign that one may have a blood disorder. A haemoglobin test is often used to check for anomie, a condition in which the body has fewer red blood cells than normal.

Resource Person Vidyadhar Gangurde Express his view haemoglobin test measures the levels of haemoglobin in the blood. Haemoglobin is a protein in the red blood cells that carries oxygen from the lungs to the rest of the body. If the haemoglobin levels are abnormal, it may be a sign that one may have a blood disorder. A haemoglobin test is often used to check for anomie, a condition in which the body has fewer red blood cells than normal.

Dr.Archana Gharud coordinated the entire event in a systematic manner.

In the camp, 47 male and 52 females got tested for haemoglobin. Out of the 102students. only 6 of them were found to have their haemoglobin level measured below 5 whereas the level of others was above 10.

This event was systematically organized by the team headed by Mr.Karnekar Sandip, the IQAC Coordinator and Programme Officer New York, Narwade, the Convenor WDC, Ms.



Gayatri Gayal of PHC Hospital, Boradpada and Mr.Vidyadhar Gangurde from Rotary Club of Kalyan. The support rendered by Ms. Vaishnavi Gite and Ms.Vaibhavi, the Nursing Assistants were appreciable.

The support given by other faculty like Mr. Jadhav Nandkumar, Head, Dept of Political Science, Assistant Professor and Mr., Kanoiiya Ashwinikumar, Department of Commerce were noteworthy.





### REPORT ON One Day Workshop on "Vermi Compost & Water Harveting"

Department of Botany & NSS with coordination if IQAC. conducted One day workshop on Vermi Compost and Water Harvesting for the under graduate and post graduate students on 21 December, 2022. The Resource person of this programme was Mr. Sachin Torve (Agriculture Asst.) and Avinash Vadate Agriculture Mr. ( Supervisor) Ambernath.. Chairman of this programme is Hon.Nagesh S.Jadhav. On the given speech Mr. Avinash Vadate and Mr. Sachin Torve says Vermicomposting is known to be the world's best fertilizer. Vermicomposting is a method of preparing enriched compost with the use of earthworms. It is one of the earliest methods to recycle agricultural waste and to produce quality compost. Vermicomposting is stable, fine granular organic manure, which enriches soil quality by improving its physiochemical and biological properties. It is highly useful in raising seedlings and for crop production. Vermicomposting is becoming popular as a major component of organic farming system. Raw material needed for Vermicomposting are: 1. Cow dung 2. Straw 3. Dry leaves 4. Water 5. Soil 6. Gunny Bag



Collection of Raw Materials:

1. Collection of Cow Dung: Cow Dung was collected in a cow shed in a nearby village from the vermicompost pit. Around 30 bags of cow dung was taken from the shed and carried by the college vehicle to the compost pit.

2. Collection of Dry Leaves: Dried leaves were collected in a large amount in the forest (Tangnuam) a little farther away from the vermicompost pit and it was carried by the college vehicle upto the compost pit

3. Collection of earthworm and straw: Earthworm and straws are collected by the students independently from different places and brought to the college with their own transport system.

4. Collection of Soil: Soil was collected within the campus itself and is carried using the college rickshaw as the distance to the compost pit was short distanced.

5. Water: Water was already available in the college campus so it was taken from the college itself
